Dear Mr. and Mrs. Rothman,

Thank you for meeting with me a few weeks ago. As you know, several of your neighbors have complained that trees on your property have grown to such levels that they constitute a substantial obstruction of the view from their respective properties. I presented this issue to our Board, and after visiting the site (which site? The neighbors? Don't want to make it seem like you trespassed on the Rothman's property), I was instructed to write you this letter.

It is the opinion of the Board that such view obstruction violates the CC&Rs imposed on all land in Tract 19890. The CC&R's are an integral part of the title to your property. In accordance with Section 9 of the CC&R's, you are kindly requested within 30 days of the receipt of this letter to remove, cut down, or cut back and maintain the trees at such a level that your neighbors views of the ocean are not obstructed. I suggest that such action be taken in a manner so as to satisfy your neighbors' complaints, and their telephone numbers are as follows:

The HOA stands ready to assist in this respect, and I offer to mediate any dispute, if necessary.

As stated in the CC&Rs, it is the responsibility of the homeowner whose trees cause view obstruction to pay for the trimming or removal of the obstructing trees. The Board also disagrees that because the trees existed before you purchased your house that they are somehow "grandfathered" in. The CC&Rs run with the land, and therefore there is no such "grandfather" clause. Indeed, as I mentioned to your at our meeting, another neighbor recently prevailed on these same issues in Superior Court, and thus the validity and enforceability of Section 9 of the CC&R's is well-settled.

It is with the cooperation of all residents in our Tract that our neighborhood is such a desirable place to live, with world-class views. We hope to maintain this friendly cooperation and look forward to your assistance in that respect.

If you are not interested in any of these proposals there is always the possibility of legal action which your neighbors could pursue. We like to avoid these drastic steps and rather prefer an amicable solution among good neighbors.

I invite you to trim your trees to such a height that your neighbors can enjoy an unobstructed ocean view they deserve to have.
